President's Message

Advocacy for the COVID vaccine is necessary to protect our patients, their families, and our families. Pregnant women are highly vulnerable to this delta variant, and we need to do all we can to protect them as women's health providers. Educating our patients about available data and the safety profile of the vaccinations is a start. The American College of Obstetrics and Gynecology, Society for Maternal Fetal Medicine, the American Academy of Physician Associates, and the Center for Disease Control and Prevention released strong statements regarding our support for immunizations in pregnancy. APAOG also vocalized our support for COVID



vaccination and we will continue to advocate for the health and safety of all women. Data from the v-safe pregnancy registry, the Vaccine Adverse Event Reporting System (VAERS), and Vaccine Safety Datalink shows no increased risk of miscarriage among women who received the mRNA COVID-19 vaccine before 20 weeks of pregnancy. Additional data did not find any safety concerns for pregnant women vaccinated late in pregnancy or their babies (CDC, 2021). We have seen an increased risk of severe illness due to this highly contagious delta variant, and the vaccine is the best available protection for them. One of the senior physician leaders at my local hospital spoke of his heartbreaking experience when hearing pregnant women say "I wish I would have been vaccinated" right before intubation. We can help them and start to tame this pandemic.

In other APAOG news, we continue to grow our membership offerings with monthly webinars, social media presence, future podcast plans, and more. We appreciate your support and look forward to expanding our reach as women's health advocates.

The <u>Women's Preventive Services Initiative (WPSI)</u> has opened the public comment period for the following draft recommendations: Counseling for Sexually Transmitted Infections, Well-Woman Preventive Visits, and Breastfeeding Services and Supplies. Public comment is an opportunity for broad public input that increases the transparency and quality of our program. The comment period for draft recommendations is **August 20**–

September 17, 2021. For timeliness, all comments must be submitted by 11:59 p.m. PT on the final day of the comment period.



The final draft recommendations will be submitted to the Health Resources and Services Administration of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services for review and inclusion under the Health Resources and Services Administration-supported Women's Preventive Services Guidelines.

PRECEPTORSHIP

NCCPA 2020 data show that only 1.2% of PAs practice in OBGYN. Without available PAs to precept our students during their Supervised Clinical Practice Experiences (SCPE), they are less likely to enter the field due to a lack of exposure, example, and opportunity. PA students show their value in all settings which is crucial in breaking down barriers for PAs wanting to enter the specialty. As a bonus, by reaching out to administrators and advocating for PAs and PA student's preceptorship opportunities, we can enlighten them on the benefits of employing PAs.
