

## **Clinical Updates**

Recommendations for women at high risk of developing breast cancer have been updated in the Practice Bulletin of the American Congress of Obstetrics and



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Gynecologists. The updated recommendations provide guidance for health care providers who manage care for patients with hereditary breast and ovarian cancer syndrome. The recommendations include "For women age 25-29 year old with known BRCA mutations, recommended breast cancer surveillance includes clinical breast examination every 6-12 months and annual radiographic screening (preferably, MRI with contrast). For women aged 30 years and older with known BRCA mutations, or other actionable breast cancer mutations, recommended breast cancer surveillance include annual mammography and annual breast MRI with contrast, often alternating every 6 months. For women who have a personal or family history of breast or ovarian cancer but who do not have a documented mutation in BCRA1, BCRA2, or other hereditary breast or ovarian cancer-associated gene should be managed based on their family history".
