#### **Clinical Updates**

#### **Pelvic Examinations in Asymptomatic Women Update**

"On March 7<sup>th</sup> the U.S. Preventative Services Task Force published a report on the performance of pelvic examinations in asymptomatic women. They concluded that there is not enough evidence to determine the benefits or harms of performing these exams in asymptomatic, non-pregnant adult women. They caution providers to utilize their report with caution. This is not meant to dissuade providers from performing pelvic examinations in asymptomatic women, but rather to indicate that more research is needed to determine the risk/benefit profile for these exams."

#### **Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome Report**

"On March 10<sup>th</sup> the CDC published a report on prevention of neonatal abstinence syndrome (NAS). They concluded that increased access to preconception care and family planning services as well as increased use of prescription drug monitoring programs are the best strategies for NAS prevention. The effects of NAS are best addressed with standardized treatments for afflicted infants and maternal opioid use disorder treatment programs. The full report is available <a href="here">here</a>."

#### CDC Report on HPV Prevalence in U.S. Population

The CDC has issued a report on the prevalence of HPV in the U.S. population. The report addresses HPV prevalence in both men and women. In women aged 18-59, from 2013-2014, the prevalence of any genital HPV was 39.9% and the prevalence of high risk genital HPV was 20.4%. The full report can be accessed here.
